



## Rotary disc

- You need 4 or 5 wooden discs.
- Drill a hole in all the discs except the bottom one.
- The ape will be able to get the tidbits when all the holes are aligned.
- You can fill the hole with pellets, raisins or other bits of food (by aligning the holes).
- Turn the discs in different directions & hang the rotary disc up.





## Raisin timber

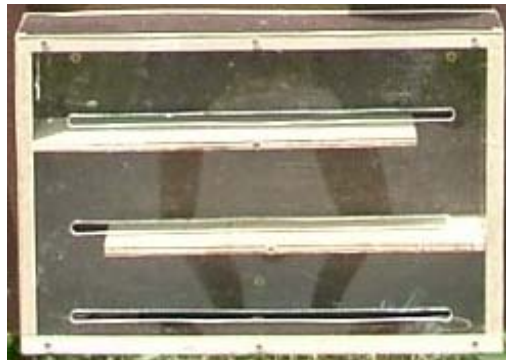
- Drill holes in a log & fill them with raisins.
- It's also possible to mount stationary termite hills in the enclosure, which can be filled with honey.





## Poking bin

- Massive wooden shelf, which is mounted in the enclosure.
- On every shelf there is a hole (see picture 2).
- The front is covered with a transparent, thick plastic door, which has slots lined up with each level through which the apes can access the shelves. This door must be locked very well.
- Put pellets or other bits of food on every shelf (particularly on the top one).
- There is a hole in the bottom-shelf. The apes have to use a tool (give them a stick) to get the tidbits out of the poking bin.





## Shaking box

- The shaking box is similar to the poking bin. The main difference is that the shaking box has only one hole at the bottom (see picture 1).
- Put Pellets or other shakes the box.
